



SIX STEPS TO BECOMING A FULBRIGHT STUDENT

Establishing eligibility: Applicants must be U.S. citizens; hold a B.A. degree or the equivalent at the time of the grant; have sufficient proficiency in the written and spoken language of the host country to carry out the proposed project; and be in good health. (Applicants lacking a degree but with extensive professional study and/or experience in fields in which they wish to pursue a project may also be considered.)




Defining a project: The study/research project is of the applicant's own design; it should be feasible and necessitate a presence in the host country.




Enrolled students: Obtain application information from the campus Fulbright Program Adviser.




At-large (not currently enrolled) applicants: Obtain application information from IIE.





Enrolled students: Complete the application and forward it to the FPA by the campus deadline. (Enrolled students will also participate in campus review panels convened by the FPA.)



At-large applicants: Complete the application and forward it to IIE by the annual October deadline.





Applications are reviewed by Fulbright National Screening Committee panels (November –December).



All applicants are notified of their status (recommended or non-recommended) by January 31.



Applications of recommended students are forwarded to Commissions/Embassies abroad for further review.
